Other situations where you will also have to file include: if you're self-employed and earned at least \$400 during the year, or if you received distributions from a health savings account. Although you may not be required to file a tax return, you may still want to file a tax return if you had any withholdings that can be refunded, or if you qualify for any refundable credits.

Sometimes, File Anyway. There are some cases where it's advisable to e-file a tax return anyway, even if you aren't required to. First, if you had federal income tax withheld from your pay, or if you made estimated tax payments, you should file in order to get any surplus withholding refunded back to you.

You might want to file a return even if you're not required to do so if it will result in receiving a tax refund—otherwise, you're just letting the IRS keep that money. This would be the case if you had any taxes withheld from your income, such as withholding

on wages or retirement plan distributions, so you overpaid your taxes because income falls below these filing thresholds—no tax is due.

Income Requirements for Filing 2019 Tax Returns

If you do not owe taxes or have to file, you may be able to get a refund. If you qualify for the California Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), you can get up to \$2,982; If you had money withheld out of your paycheck for state taxes, you may be able to get a refund; You are leaving ftb.ca.gov.

Now, if your total income is below certain levels, you are not always required to file a tax return. For example, if you are single, with no dependents, and are not being claimed as a dependent on another return, then you don't have to file a tax return if you earned income (not investments or self
